Why NOT the Thread Lift?



On a daily basis, at least one patient asks our opinion about the “thread lift”. In response to this question, let me express some of our thoughts on this procedure: For those who are not familiar with it, the “thread lift” involves placement of non-absorbable barbed sutures under the skin. The sutures are then suspended to a position higher up in the scalp, in an effort to “lift” the jowls, cheeks, etc... Unfortunately, it has been clear for over three decades that suspension of the skin alone will not result in any meaningful or long-lasting lift. Similar procedures performed 30 years ago were met initially with enthusiasm, and then quickly faded. The skin has an inherent elasticity and ability to “creep” back into position. However, if the underlying muscle and fat is used as a scaffold (as in an endoscopic midface or true neck lift), the quality and longevity of the result is much greater. In fact, at a recent facial plastic surgery conference in Las Vegas that I attended, a panel of experts discussed their 2 year experience with the “thread lift”, and found results last about 4 or 5 months. Given the cost, potential complications, short term results, and long convalescence, I would encourage you to ask your physician for photographs of one year postoperative results if you are considering this procedure.
